Blind Faith made their debut gig in London Hyde Park at a free concert in front of an estimated crowd of 100,000 fans. The concert was not particularly good but the highlights were the unexpected version of 'Under My Thumb' and Eric Burdon's solo in 'Dancing in the Streets'. A short Sunday afternoon was followed by a huge US tour Blind Faith American tour opened at the Newport Jazz Festival on 18th Jan. The tour turned to be a disaster at Madison Square Garden in New York there were riots and everywhere there were disappointed audiences. Captain first public appearance at returning from Blind Faith America tour was at a meeting of the Music City Club when he was asked to give the band the go-ahead. The band were not to be heard from again until they were back in the States in 1970. The band were supported by American while they were in the States. They were on their last and putting up for the day their new Chapter sponsored tour for Delaney and Bonnie in 1970 and played on stage with them. They started in Germany and went on to the UK and Frankfurt in Germany they had a disastrous reception. The UK tour which opened at the Royal Albert Hall in 1st December was successful and George Harrison played them for most of the UK dates.
